

Dominican welcomes Kelly Corrigan to lecture series

Corrigan, author of three previous memoirs, discussed her newest, *Glitter and Glue*, which explores the bond between mothers and daughters. Oprah Winfrey recently recommended the memoir on Oprah.com as one of her top 14 books to pick up in February.

In addition, *Glitter and Glue* jumped to No. 2 on Sunday's *New York Times* bestseller list for Hardcover Non-Fiction for February 23.

The [speaker series](#), a cooperative effort between [Dominican's ILS](#) and Book Passage, features some of the country's leading figures from the worlds of business, politics, entertainment, academia, and literature. It has entertained and educated thousands of Marin County and San Francisco Bay Area residents.

All lectures are open to the public. The Corrigan lecture begins at 7 p.m. in Angelico Hall on Acacia Avenue. Doors open at 6 p.m.

Corrigan is a contributor to *O, the Oprah Magazine* as well as *Good Housekeeping* and *Glamour*. A breast cancer survivor, she is a co-founder of the philanthropy program "Notes and Words," a series featuring musicians and well-known writers together on stage that has raised more than \$4 million for Children's Hospital in Oakland. Audience members are donors to the Children's Hospital and Research Center in Oakland, where one of Corrigan's two daughters was treated for meningitis.
